

Re: Yellowknife Project

I presume that the samples I shipped to the laboratory about a week ago reached there safely as I have not received any wire advising me of broken bottles. We have now completed our stack sampling at Con and will be moving to Giant later this afternoon to take stack samples there. This will be completed on Friday, the 20th.

Mike will be leaving on Saturday, the 21st, and will be in to work on Monday, the 23rd. I shall leave here on Tuesday, the 24th, and shall stop in Edmonton one day to see Jack Grainge, the Public Health Engineer, Pat Bouthillier, Sanitary Engineer at the University of Alberta, and Mr. E. E. Owen, former Safety Director of the Workmen's Compensation Board of Alberta, all of whom have asked me to go to see them to discuss various problems in our field. I shallleave Edmonton Wednesday night and stop in Winnipeg at 423 Scotia Street until Saturday, the 28th. I will be home Sunday, the 29th, and in to work on Monday. Work has been proceeding at a normal or slightly slower pace but is now speeding up and we will be going full blast until we leave.
