Superintendent Kirkby signalled May 14 that one child died from arsenic poisoning from drinking water vicinity of Yellowknife Stop have advised him to contact the coroner and have stomach and contents sent out for analysis Stop Drummond informed me today that he received a request from Gooderham for immediate action as there are others ill presumably with same conditions Stop he recommended to Gooderham to have body sent but for proper diagnosis as he doubts any contamination in view of stringent precautions takenby mining company and recent satisfactory inspection by chief inspector from Ottawa Stop for your information and advise as to and any other measures that should be carried out.
