Dear Dr. Cameron:

I am sorry that my reply to your letter of 13 August to Dr. Solandt, in connection with the situation at Yellowknife, has been delayed, but I had a little difficulty in getting hold of the various people concerned.

I understand from Kingsley Kay, in a telephone conversation the other day, that there is no question of DRB undertaking this investigation and I think that, providing it does not take up too much of Dr. Katz' time, we would be very willing indeed to make him available to you, subject to suitable dates being arranged with the Chief Superintendent, DRCL, to assist in planning the survey at Yellowknife. I do not know if Dr. Katz could be made available for sufficiently long to assist in the conduct of the survey, as this may take some time.

I was also talking to Dr. MacFarland, who has been discussing the matter with Dr. Katz, and it may be that you would wish to have the benefit of Dr. MacFarland's advice from a purely toxicological aspect.

I should be glad if you would let me know your wishes, and we will do everything possible to assist in the survey.
