Dear Dr. Kay:

I am sorry that my reply to your letter of October 18th was delayed. I have been away attending sessions of the Sloan Commission and have just returned.

Our testing procedure on the Con stack measures the efficiency of collection by determination of the total weight of particulate matter or the amount of arsenic leaving the stack. In making this determination, we pass a metered amount of the gas through a Whatman Thimble and determine the total arsenic content. In this way we are able to get a figure showing the pounds per day of arsenic leaving the stack.

Please advise if I can be of any further assistance in this matter.
