Enclosed are photographs of Veronica Lake, also key sketch showing the direction photographs were taken. These were taken when Dr. K. Kay was in Yellowknife recently in connection with arsenic disposal. The Giant Mine were planning on using this lake for the storage of arsenic from their cottrell plant. This lake has only one apparent outlet that is shown on photographs "H" and "N". The rest of the basin is completely rock rimmed. It was their plan to pump out some of the water and pipe the dry arsenic into the remaining water and put it back into solution. The outlet would be sealed off by a concrete dam.

Before using this basin two problems have to be solved, one to ensure that there are no other outlets, two, if the outlet is sealed off will there be sufficient water intake to overflow either the dam or other low spots surrounding the basin.

Dr. Kay asked that these photographs be sent to him.
