Dear Dr. Kay:

We have been taking specimens of Con and Yellowknife domestic water for arsenic determination at weekly intervals. Arsenic content of these waters is now in the neighbourhood of .Ol mgs/L and I wonder if you will be satisfied if we decrease the frequency of sampling to once per month. This would relieve the pressure on our laboratory somewhat but the pressure is not of sufficient importance that we would resist your wishes in any way. Please advise.

I note in my letter to you November 6th, 1950 with regard to determination of stack loss, I said that we passed a metered amount of gas through a Whatman thimble. This is not quite correct. We use a woolen bag instead of the paper thimble. The principle is the same but I thought it best to correct the statement.
