Dear Steve:

It has been decided that we will determine arsenic in one milk sample. Will you, therefore, please do the following:

- 1) On Monday morning, buy one quart (or a pint if it is available) of locally produced milk and get a receipt.
- 2) Shake the bottle thoroughly and pour the milk into the two quart sealers that I left there. I think they are in the pails underneath the table. They should be thoroughly rinsed with clean water before the milk is put into them.
- 3) Take the milk to the hospital and have four or five drops of chloroform added to each one.
- 4) Ship the samples air-express to Mr. J. L. Monkman, Occupational Health Laboratory, Department of National Health and Welfare, 200 Kent Street, Ottawa, Ontario.

I am enclosing seventy cents which I think will cover the price of the milk. Will you please send me the receipt for our petty cash.
