URINE ANALYSIS AND CONTROLS - YELLOWKNIFE

This is to confirm our conversation of this morning. It was agreed that 50 urinary samples should be forwarded from Yellowknife to the Industrial Hygiene Laboratory each month for analysis and that I shall make the necessary selection of donors and arrangements for collection and shipment from Yellowknife. The arrangements for returning the bottles to Yellowknife will be in the hands of the Industrial Hygiene Lab.

The number 50, was agreed to on the grounds that this was considered the largest number capable of being handled by the Industrial Hygiene Laboratory due to other commitments.

Re Controls - It was agreed that on my return from Yellowknife I should contact Dr. Day with a view to selecting 50 school children in Ottawa, corresponding in group to those in Yellowknife, to provide samples of urine for analysis at the rate of 50 per month for the corresponding 6 months that we will be receiving samples of urine from Yellowknife. These urines will also be analyzed at the Industrial Hygiene Laboratory.
