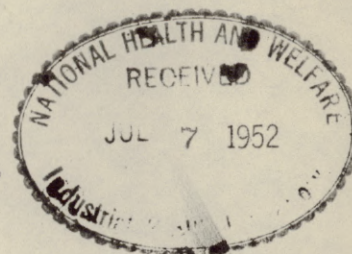


Dear Dr. Kay:

Herewith, are the results of atmospheric dust settling tests as determined by the catch in "fall pans". Pans were placed Nov. 23rd and 24th, 1951, and were taken in on Apr. 10th, 1952., giving a total exposure time of 138 and 139 days.

Pan #2, located at the south end of Rat Lake had been damaged and no figure is given for this area. All other pans were in good condition.

Pan #1, East Corner, New Townsite;	Exposed 139 days;	lbs. As/Acre/Yr. = .8	✓
Pan #3, Near Con Boiler House;	" 138 " " "	= .97	✓
Pan #4, Pud Lake Outlet;	" 138 " " "	= 1.04	✓
Pan #5, North End Kam Lake;	" 139 " " "	= .96	✓
Pan #6, Kam Lake, West, Near Grace;	" 138 " " "	= .65	✓
