The Industrial Health Division is now handling several problems in air pollution. I believe you will recall the details which I gave you last May with regard to the serious arsenic case at Yellowknife.

We would be most appreciative if Mr. Clayton might be permitted to come to Ottawa for this purpose and possibly to speak before a number of other governmental officers on the air pollution situation in your country. Thursday and Friday, November 15 and 16 would be desirable dates if the visit could be authorized.
