Dear Mr. Archdale:

I should like to outline to you the plans for my next visit to Yellowknife, in order that you may guide me regarding the most suitable time to examine your pupils. Firstly, I have to visit the Okanagan Valley and that can not be done until after May 20th. I should require to spend at least one week there. I am told that the arsenic content in the water at Yellowknife is highest during the first few days of June, (Steve Homulous) so that my visit should be timed close to this period. I also must take into consideration the fact that your school exams will be in June and that school closes by the end of June.

From the above it would appear that I shall have to fit my visit in during the first two weeks of June assuming your examinations to take place in the latter two weeks. I should greatly appreciate your advice as to the best dates for me to arrive in order to carry out the examinations which will take approximately two weeks.
